IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF ARUBA
FOR HORSES EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by U.S Origin Health Certificate issued by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and the consignee and individual identification of the animals to be exported. Additional information shall include:

CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS

1. The horse(s) were examined and found free or examined and treated for control of ectoparasites on (date) _____ with _____ (name of product).
2. The horse(s) were vaccinated against rabies on (date) _____ with _____ (name of product). [Note: vaccine should be administered between 180 days and 30 days of export].

TEST RESULTS

1. The animals were negative to the agar-gel immunodiffusion (Coggins) test for equine infectious anemia within 180 days prior to the date of export. (Show date of test.)

OTHER INFORMATION

1. The animals must be transported in clean and disinfected vehicles.
