**IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF EL SALVADOR FOR DOGS AND CATS  
EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES**

The animals must be accompanied by a health certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian, and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the owner, and complete identification of the animal (name, breed, sex and age). Additional information shall include:

**Certification Statements:**

1. The animal(s) were examined and found to be free of any infectious diseases.

**Vaccinations and treatments:**

1. The animal(s) were vaccinated against rabies. The vaccine must be given no greater than 12 months and no sooner than 30 days prior to departure. (The rabies vaccination certificate, which should include date of vaccination, product name and serial number, must accompany the health certificate).

2. The animal(s) were treated against endo- and ecto-parasites. (The treatment must be given no greater than 6 months and no sooner than 30 days prior to departure).

3. a) Dogs must be vaccinated against distemper, parvovirus, hepatitis, leptospirosis, and parainfluenza no greater than 12 months and no sooner than 30 days prior to departure.

- b) Cats must be vaccinated against panleucopenia no greater than 6 months and no sooner than 30 days prior to departure.

**Other Information:**

1. The health certificate must be issued within 10 days prior to departure.

2. Following endorsement, the health certificate should be validated at the nearest Consulate Office of El Salvador.
