## IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF EGYPT FOR FEEDER CATTLE (STEERS) EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate (VS Form 17-140) issued by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the consignor and the consignee and complete identification of the animals to be exported. The other information shall include:

### CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS

1. The animals originated from the United States of America.
2. The United States is free of foot-and-mouth disease, cattle plague (rinderpest), contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, lumpy skin disease, Rift Valley fever, peste des petits ruminants, sheep pox, hog cholera, African swine fever, swine vesicular disease, and Teschen disease. This declaration is made by the U.S. veterinary authorities USDA/APHIS/VS and confirmed by OIE.
3. The animals originated from farms or establishments where no case of vesicular stomatitis or bluetongue has occurred for the last 6 months.

### TEST REQUIREMENTS

Tuberculosis - intradermal skin test in the caudal fold using bovine PPD within 60 days of export.

### OTHER INFORMATION

1. The animals must be treated against fascioliasis prior to export and the second dose of drug must be shipped with each consignment at exporter's expense.
2. The health certificate must be visaed (legalized) by the Embassy of the Arab Republic of Egypt.

### EMBARKATION STATEMENTS

At the port of embarkation, the USDA port veterinarian shall attach to the U.S. Origin Health Certificate the Certificate of Inspection of Export Animals (VS Form 17-37) showing:

1. The name and address of the consignor.
2. The name and address of the consignee.

3. The number of animals to be shipped.
4. A statement that the animals have been given a careful veterinary inspection at the port of embarkation and found free from evidence of communicable disease and exposure thereto within 24 hours of exportation.
